


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DART is a specialist training provider which contracts with the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA), to offer land-based training in **Derbyshire and surrounding** counties.

An apprenticeship is a real job, with hands-on experience, a salary and the chance to learn skills and knowledge while you work. You're treated just like all the other employees, with a contract of employment and holiday leave.

If you're 16 or over, you can become an apprentice as long as you spend at least 50% of your working hours in England for the duration of the apprenticeship and you are not in full-time education.

Apprenticeships Standards

Apprenticeships are not just for school leavers. They are for anyone 16 and over including graduates, adults wishing to up-skill or retrain as well as managers.

- + Opportunity to learn theory and apply it practically.
- + DART offers both Level 2 and Level 3 apprenticeship standards dependent of individual sectors
- + The duration of these programmes range from 12 months and a day to 36 months
- + In most subject areas learners will attend off-the-job training to study topics specific to their chosen industry. Some sessions may be away from the workplace


- + At least 20% of your time will be spent learning new skills or knowledge at work or away from the workplace on industry visits or training sessions
- + End point assessments take place at the end of your apprenticeship and confirm whether you complete the apprenticeship with a pass, merit or distinction





Lucy has always been interested in animals since she was a young girl, and always knew she wanted to pursue a career in the animal world. After finishing GCSEs, she went to Broomfield College to complete an Extended Diploma in Animal Care. During her time at college, she was chosen to go on two trips abroad with Derby College; one to Estonia to work in an animal shelter and one to South Africa to participate in conservation work. This started her passion for combining animal-related work with travelling.

It was whilst she was at college that she discovered that she had an interest in veterinary work, as she volunteered at Pride Veterinary Centre in the resort doing kennel and hydrotherapy work, and at Scarsdale Equine working as a groom.

She was then offered an apprenticeship to be a trainee veterinary nurse at Pride Vets. through DART and Bottle Green Training which lasted for two and a half years.

Now, after qualifying to be a registered veterinary nurse in 2018, she has become a locum RVN and has worked in multiple small animal referral hospitals in the UK, as well as doing a foal season in Newmarket as a neonatal intensive care nurse and working as a temporary lecturer at the college that she studied at!

Being a locum has allowed her to choose her own holidays and work on her own terms, to allow her to follow her passion for volunteering and working abroad. Since qualifying she has done lots more travelling, and has done multiple veterinary projects in Spain, Sardinia and Morocco, as well as working in Lapland, Finland for two winters as an Elf! She has many more planned, including working as a bear nurse in China and doing more foal seasons in New Zealand and Australia.

Core knowledge, skills and behaviour

The learner will learn about legislation, health and safety, maintanance of accommodation, exercise and enrichment, control and restraint, feeding, customer care and animal first aid. These will then all be put into practice to turn the knowledge into skills.

The learner will look at safe working, work ethic, team work, responsibility, communication and professionalism.

Countryside workers carry out specific environmental and conservation tasks and they will also be clear about how practical conservation work interacts with the productive and recreational use of the countryside. This includes livestock and crop production and sporting activities and how these relate to countryside management practices.

Work will include:

- Building and repairing a variety of field boundaries including fences, walls and hedging
- Maintaining public rights of way for walkers, cyclists and horse riders
- Improving habitats and woodland to get them in good condition by using a variety of appropriate techniques, including pruning, felling or planting so plants and animals can thrive

 Surveying/monitoring habitats, plants and animals to understand species numbers and relate this to relevant habitat management practices

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VETERINARY NURSING





Learners can gain a Veterinary Nurse level 3 Apprenticeship Standard.



Learners will gain a Stockperson level 2 Apprenticeship Standard or a Crop Technician level 3 Apprenticeship Standard.

Pre-apprenticeship programmes are also available in this area.

Veterinary Nursing learners must be employed at a practice registered with the RCVS (Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons) to take trainees. We strongly recommend that all students work at a veterinary practice for a minimum of 6 months prior to enrolment.

A structured programme of day release classes is provided over the three year programme, covering theory for the Level 3 Diploma and standard requirements.

A learner must have achieved 5 GCSE's at grade A-C/9-4 or equivalents to include maths, English language and science at the time of application. Functional skills level 2 is acceptable. Certificates must be provided to prove this.

A learner must be working alongside a clinical coach in the practice for a minimum of 2 days per week.

Stock Person

The key role for a Stockperson is to raise the animals with optimal welfare and consideration for their needs throughout the different stages of their life. This is practical work involving a combination of technology and manual labour. Being a stockperson requires compassion, selfmotivation and the ability to work in a team and independently.

Crop Technician

As a Crop Technician you will be responsible for optimising crop/ plant yields through establishment, management, harvest and post-harvest operations, while maintaining and improving the surrounding environment.
