YMCA

What age range do you help train and support?

YMCA accept students aged 16-18 or up to 24 with an Education Health Care Plan.

Do you offer any work with sports? Do you offer boxing opportunities?

Unfortunately, the YMCA are not able to offer this at present.

As well as gaining qualifications, what else do you think would help an applicant stand out?

We like to know about any interests or hobbies that an applicant has as well as any achievements in addition to qualifications. For example; you may play a musical instrument, been successful in martial arts or belong to a swimming club. Or perhaps you volunteer somewhere or have a part time job. It helps if applicants are on time, polite and have thought about their appearance. Also have some questions of your own ready to ask.

Does your institution provide any work experience/taster sessions/virtual open days which students can access before they apply?

YMCA offer visits to our centres on a 1;1 basis by appointment where you can have a look round and meet tutors. We have done virtual open days and are planning to do more in the future. We would be happy to arrange a taster session for anyone interested.

What courses do you offer and when do your courses start? How long are the courses?

Our courses for 16-18 year olds are called Study Programmes where you study a subject, functional skills in maths and English and Employability/Personal Development.

You can join our courses at any time of the year not just September as we are roll on – roll off. Most of our courses are between 34-39 weeks long.

Our Chesterfield centre currently offers level 1 and 2 in Digital Skills and level 1 and 2 in Caring for Children.

We have small class sizes which helps students who may struggle in a large college environment, providing a safe, secure and more individual learning experience.

Are there apprenticeships for everything? E.g. architecture and photography.

YMCA do not currently offer apprenticeships but are planning to in the future so watch this space!

Are all of your courses Level 2/3 courses or do you also do Higher Level or Degree Apprenticeships?

All of our courses are level 1 or level 2. We do not offer any apprenticeships at the moment.

What are the benefits of apprenticeships?

The benefits of apprenticeships are that you learn in a real work environment, get paid while you learn and usually have a better chance of gaining permanent employment when you complete your apprenticeship, often with the same company.
